MAKE ONLINE PAYMENTS

Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner. These details are not passed back to the school.

The payment page is accessed from the school's website <u>www.murwillume-p.schools.nsw.edu.au</u> Click on '*\$Make a Payment*' and complete all the mandatory fields and select from the relevant 'Payment options'.

The expenses (payment options) that can be paid online are:

- Voluntary School Contributions
- Workbooks
- Excursions please write excursion title in the reference box
- Sporting activities
- Other -

When you access '\$ Make a Payment' you MUST enter:

- Student's full name and date of birth AND
- Select from the relevant 'Payment Options' selection

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

You will need to make individual payments for each student.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

Permission notes for excursions have a space to record the online payment receipt number. Payment for excursions must be made no later than two working days prior to the due date identified on the note.
